

How to Create a

Mission Prayer Corner for your Classroom!

1. Choose the Space

- Select a quiet, visible corner of the room.
- Use a small table, shelf, or crate covered with a cloth (liturgical color of the season works great, or something from a mission area!).

2. Set the Focal Point

- Place a crucifix or image of Jesus at the center.
- Add a statue or image of Mary or a patron saint of missions like: St. Thérèse of Lisieux or St. Francis Xavier

3. Include the World

- Add a globe, map, or World Mission Rosary to
- represent the global Church. Consider labeling different continents or countries in need of prayer.

4. Prayer Materials

- Bibles or children's Scripture books
- A "Mission Prayer Book" with intercessions for children around the world
- Mission-themed prayer cards or prayer intentions box
- Printed monthly Mission Prayer (from the Missionary Childhood Association or your Diocese)
- A sign with the Popes Monthly Prayer Intentions

5. Mission Symbols

- A mite box for collecting mission donations
- Rosaries (especially World Mission Rosaries)
- Flags or cultural items from different countries

6. Interactive/ Monthly Components

- A "Prayer Leader" chart: rotate students who lead a prayer each day.
- A "Mission Focus of the Month" poster (highlight a country, or missionary saint
- Encourage students to add their own prayers for children in the missions.
- Decorate or update the space based on liturgical seasons (Advent, Lent, etc.) and mission months (October for World Mission Month)
