**EUROPE** 

White symbolizing Europe, the home of the Holy Father, shepherd of the world:



May all children have a safe home and that Pope Francis continues in his support of young people.

You can say a Hail Mary for the millions of children today displaced in Europe due to war, and for peace in their home countries.

Each year, support from MCA provides for more than 2 million children who are enrolled in catechesis and Christian formation programs, as well as more than 600,000 children from nursery school to secondary school.

## ASIA


Yellow represents the Morning Light of the East, in Asia:

## **AMERICA**

Blue for the waters surrounding the Islands of the Pacific:




May all children have fresh, clean drinking water everyday.
